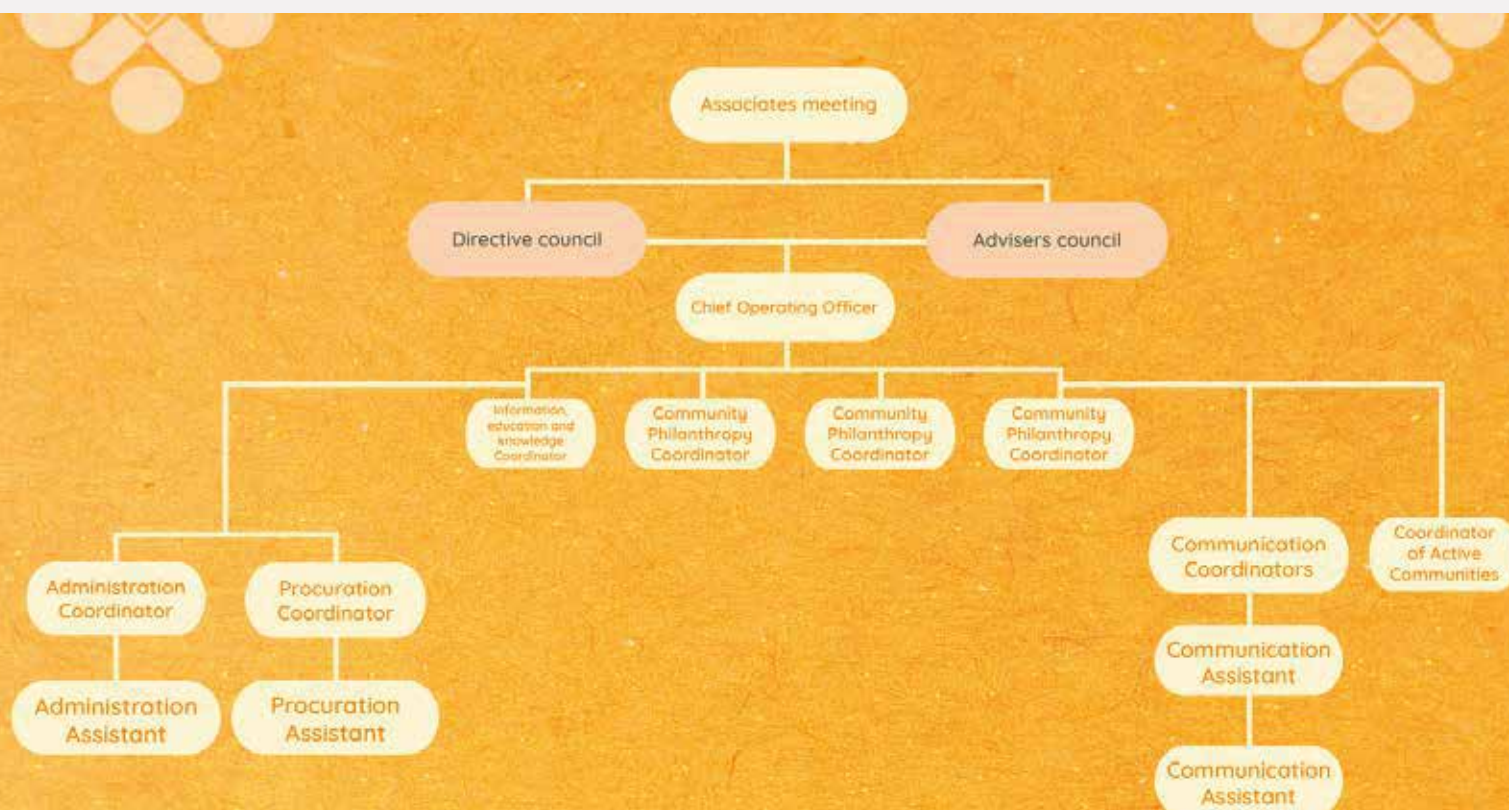

RESTRUCTURING OF THE COMMUNITY PHILANTHROPY PROGRAM

STRATEGY FOR STRENGTHENING OF COUNCILS

From January to May 2022 the Directive Council and the Chief Operating Officer of our community foundation actively participated in the formative training sessions for the Strategy for Strengthening of Councils organized by **Comunalia** and led by **Ana Maria Leon**. It was a priority for the foundation to participate in this process with the aim of strengthening our governance, understanding the needs in this area, and developing further good practices.



COMMITTEES

In order to strengthen the work we do in our community foundation, this year we activated committees, integrated with people who are part of the operative team and members of the directive council.

Strategy Committee:

In January 2022, the Strategy Committee was created, a space where the president, **José Luis Mijangos**, the vice president, **Kate Hart Waters** of the directive council, and the Chief Operating Officer, **Corinne Pierre-Louis** take part in developing strategies for the foundation and accompanying the implementation of them.

Communication Committee:

At the beginning of this year, two members of the directive council: **Susana Moran**, Treasurer and **Hileana Garcia**, Secretary, accompanied **Jessica Piene**, Communication Coordinator of the operative team to think about communication strategies and linking our community foundation.



ARTICULATION AXIS

In May 2022, the Articulation Axis was created consisting of the Chief Operating Officer and the Coordinators of the different areas of Amigos of San Cristobal in order to generate a space for information exchange and multiply the interaction between the areas, which helps us to have greater connection and develop collective and collaborative practices for our work.

In order to continue to strengthen our good practices, on June 21st, we had our Ordinary General Assembly of Associates (Asamblea General Ordinaria de Asociados) virtually where we reflected on the work of 2021 and planned for the year 2022.

SIGNING OF AGREEMENT

On February 16th, 2022, we celebrated the signature of partnership with the 9 (nine) Sister Organizations organizations that we will be accompanying during 2022, which have projects that affect our three priority areas: **education, environment and health**, seeking to impact the lives of children, young people, women, and families in the rural and urban areas of the Chiapas Highlands and San Cristóbal de las Casas.





Sister organizations of 2022



AMEXTRA



FProject:

Integral Health in The Highlands of Chiapas.

The participants of the project are Tzotsils from rural areas of The Highlands of Chiapas. This project is born from the desire of families to see their kids strong, with energy, with creativity, and with a bright future. Because of the priorities of the community, this sister organization mainly works with health and nutrition factors that impact infants.

Examples of these initiatives are: Greenhouse production, food preparation workshops, deworming, spring rehabilitation, dry bath construction, wood stoves, among others. On February 22nd of this year, we visited Xulumo, Aldama, Chiapas, to observe the work in the greenhouses.



ÁNGELES DE AMOR



Project:

Integral Community Center for Training and Social Entrepreneurship for the Reduction of Barriers to Disability.

During our visit on February 11th, we learned about the facilities of our Sister organization, located in the urban area of San Cristobal de las Casas. We had the opportunity to share with young participants of the center, who take pedagogical classes according to their disability and at the same time we are able to know the eco-educational park they are building. We emphasize the commitment of Angeles de Amor to raise awareness about the need to build a space with a social and integral approach that recognizes people with disabilities as a human rights subject.



Project:

Strengthening to a Community Health Strategy in Nine Localities in San Juan Cancuc (Highlands Region), Chiapas.

On March 18th, we accompanied the operative team of Conider to the Tsaltealja locality in San Juan Cancuc, to follow up on the deworming campaign they are implementing in the municipality. We were able to meet some families involved in the campaign. In this visit, we were part of the follow-up to the population that is favored with the medication: They ensure that the people of the community are taking the medications properly, they monitor in case there are other symptoms and they accompany in the process to strengthen the diet. Additionally, Conider implements parallel projects to the campaign that strengthen the health care of the inhabitants. During this visit, the vegetable garden project was presented.



FORO PARA EL DESARROLLO SUSTENTABLE (CON EL COLECTIVO MUJERES Y MAÍZ)



Project:

Agro-ecological community for good living.

Last February 2nd, we accompanied Francisca Velasco López who is part of the Colectivo de Mujeres y Maíz Criollo (Women and Corn Criollo collective). We learned about some activities carried out by members of this group and other groups that are part of the project. Its proposal is born from the need of many families to have a space for support and interaction with different actors to face the health, food and unemployment crisis. The aim is to strengthen the different areas of work of the groups and to be alternative teaching-learning spaces for the strengthening of skills of girls, boys, adolescents, mothers and fathers. During our visit we knew the school garden project they carry out in the urban area of San Cristobal de las Casas, and we were able to visit “El Semillero” where families had a meeting space where they addressed the problem of gender violence in the community through the theater.

HOGAR COMUNITARIO



Project:

New Women, Integral Development for Indigenous Women with Unplanned Pregnancy and Single Migrants Mothers to the City.

On February 17th, we attended the first monthly meeting of women from the Hogar Comunitario (Community Home). This is a space that seeks women with unplanned pregnancy and mothers alone to improve their living conditions and to move toward their integral development, free of violence, and in conditions of equity. The main goals of this project are for women with unplanned pregnancy to experience a humanized birth in optimal physical and emotional conditions. It is also intended that single mothers/women strengthen their technical and human capacities for self-employment, and collective work by earning complementary income.



MUTRAM



Project:

Building territories of hope. Educational strategies in gender and health with children, women and men.

Last March 26th, we had the opportunity to accompany our Sister organization MUTRAM, at the “Training in Body-Territory-Earth Health” workshop held in San Cristobal de Las Casas. The groups Ceiba, Collective Hummingbirds and Collective Phases of the Moon participated. The core activities of this workshop were based on the use of traditional herbal medicine to treat certain conditions of the human body, with special emphasis on some gynecological ailments. The workshop also developed with some spiritual parts in the activation of chakras and meditation, which allowed the active participation of the attendees.

OMNIUNITY (WITH THE BARRIO BRAVO POPULAR AUTONOMOUS GYMNASIUM AND THE YI'BEL IK' RAÍZ DEL VIENTO COMMUNITY HEALTH HOUSE)



Project:

Young people, women and health in the original Cuxtitali Neighborhood: A proposal for popular self-organization.

On March 25th we visited the facilities of Yi'bel Ik' Raíz del Viento Community Health House and the Barrio Bravo Popular Autonomous Gymnasium. We know of a project that seeks to build and strengthen community health spaces in coordination with the Cuxtitali neighborhood, aimed especially at women and young people, to promote health care from an integral, community perspective, through primary care, prevention, and the promotion of sports and healthy lifestyles. The project has two main lines of work: The Health House and the Popular Gym. The Health House seeks to strengthen the work axis "Women and Health". While the Popular Gym seeks to strengthen the infrastructure of the sport promotion work for the youth of the neighborhood.



SOLMUNDI



Project:

Center for training and training in agroecology from local contributions and knowledge.

On February 13th, joined by the Solmundi operative team, we visited a family group, they are participants of a project in the town of Pozo, municipality of San Juan Cancuc, Chiapas. The project seeks to promote spaces of practical training with an agro-ecological perspective that allow peasant multi-family units in The Highlands region of Chiapas to reassess ancestral knowledge, obtaining their food while taking care of mother earth, in addition to that, they can generate with the surpluses an extra economic income.

This project seeks food sovereignty in the families with whom it works by raising awareness of the importance of the agro-ecological transition and the recovery of community knowledge.



Project:

Tirra Roja (Red Land), land of peace. Integral learning, peaceful coexistence and alternative social spaces for young people in the urban periphery of San Cristobal de Las Casas.

Tierra Roja Cuxtitali Community Center A.C. is an integral, multicultural and multi-generational educational proposal aimed at children, youth, women and adult men of indigenous and mestizo origin in the urban periphery of San Cristobal de Las Casas. The project focuses on providing free educational and training activities that expand the population segment with access to basic education by promoting spaces of integration and community coexistence where personal and collective human rights can be exercised. OPERATIVE TEAM OPERATIVE MANAGEMENT

Visit of the Daniele Agostino Derossi Foundation

In April we recieved the visit of our donor and ally **Armando J. Alfonzo**, director of the Daniele Agostino Derossi Foundation. We shared spaces for reflection and visited the projects "Barrio Bravo" Popular Autonomous Gymnasium and the Yi'bel Ik' Raíz del Viento Community Health House.

Visit Ecosur

On Friday, May 13th, the operative team, joined by some members of the directive counsil, were part of the Agriculture Department's talk "Poverty and the Poor People's Campaign in the U.S", an event coordinated by the Society and Environment Department of the College of the Southern Border (ECOSUR). The talk left us with much to reflect on as we could know at close hand the current situation of inequity and experiences of the citizens of the United States. This also provides us with clarity regarding how social injustices affect us all as a society.



MANAGEMENT

Management processes

In these months, among other day-to-day tasks, related to payments, contracts, training and expense control of our Sister organizations, we were preparing the annual budget of our community foundation. The semiannual financial report for the Inter-American Foundation (IAF) and the annual transparency report of authorized donors.

Changes in the Management Team

Our dear **Beatriz Álvarez**, who has accompanied the Management area for the last 9 years, will challenge herself in leading our new area called Coordination of Information, Education and Knowledge. The area will be responsible for designing and supervising materials and activities that help to disseminate our work with a special emphasis on the Community Philanthropy program.

In addition, the area will be in charge of preparing reports for our funders; systematizing processes and learning methodologies that are encompassed in the work of each of the areas. It will also support the creation of content for the different communication channels; managing strengthening workshops for the Sister organizations with which we collaborate; and cultivating relationships with the different social actors, donors and interest groups for the foundation. We know that it has not been easy for Beatriz to leave her administrative role, but she is sure that her commitment will remain intact and we are confident that she will be able to accompany this new ad hoc coordination to her profile as a communicologist.

COMMUNITY PHILANTHROPY

Community Philanthropy Program

During the first six months of 2022, the Community Philanthropy Program (FC) focused its efforts primarily on the management work and restructuring of the area. We worked accompanying the creation of a manual of educational materials and the translation into the languages of the program of the program - Spanish, Tzotzil, Tzeltal and English -; we also collaborated on the drafting of the annual report of Friends of San Cristobal A.C. (ASC); as well as in the accompaniment of the Giving Circles (CDD). We participated in sessions for the creation of the Annual Operating Plan and the strategic lines of ASC; we also participated with the directive council and with others different organizations to discuss racial equity from different spaces, the concept of the Giving Circles, and learning binomials with organizations. Below we will share in more detail the progress we have made during the last months and the path we have traveled in these months.



Funding Agencies



The Community Philanthropy (CP) program is funded by the W. K. Kellogg Foundation in its Catalyzing Community Giving (CCG) program, the Inter-American Foundation (IAF) and the Global Fund for Community Foundation (GFCF), this involves a number of responsibilities that we follow up on a daily basis, but there are also others that we must report in a timely manner according to the requirements of each agency. Thus, in this first half of 2022, the CP coordinators worked on the drafting of the various annual and semi-annual reports, as well as interviews with each of the funders. With these reports we share: the progress we have madeThe path we have traveled - hand in hand with the members of the CDDs, the friendly projects, the operative team, the directive council of Amigos de San Cristobal and the different people who are linked to the program -, we also share the challenges, the learning and the plans we have for the program. In hopes to generate ties and being able to provide continuity to the program through the funding of these agencies.

Giving Circles

CDD Friends of the Mountain

The CDD Friends of the mountain has been paused since December 2021 due to the diverse personal, work and academic activities of its members. However, under the general restructuring of the CP program and the guidelines it implies, in April, 2022, each one of its members decided autonomously to end participation. Thanks to the work and the collective identity that they built over a year, The Friends of the Mountain can visualize the possibility of continuing to collaborate in new ways and in other spaces with CP. Thus, Friends of the mountain was and will be testimony of other forms of giving, of the construction of a collective identity that sought to resignify philanthropy through the recognition of time, talent and witness focusing on strengthening the rural and urban areas of The Highlands of Chiapas through commitment and the collective efforts to actively combat social injustices.





CDD Sejk'ubal Kuxlejal (The Rainbow of Life)

CDD Sejk'ubal Kuxlejal (The Rainbow of Life), integrated composed of Tzeltal people from the region, had a pause on their activities since January of this year, the personal and work occupation of each one of its members prevented the continuity of their monthly sessions. In April, with the help of their coordinator, they resumed the group communication by holding an online meeting to know about the current status of the CP program and to define the situation of their circle. The members decided to continue the collaboration with our foundation under the approach in which they have laid the foundations for their work. In May and June, they have focused on developing and refining their work plan and timetable that involves active participation, as well as raising awareness on environmental issues, gender violence, exchange of knowledge, and ties with the Sister organizations to our community foundation.

Yibel Jnopbentik CDD (Rooting Knowledge)

The Yibel Jnopbentik CDD, is integrated of Tzotzil women from The Chiapas Highlands region, made a pause on their activities since December 2021. Its members found themselves limited in time and space on their agendas, which prevented them from meeting during these months. During this period, individual and group communication has been maintained between them and the coordinator of the CDD. In the conversations generated in these spaces they manifested the need to manage the search and integration of new members to the circle, with similar interests to those established by Yibel: "strengthen the participation of women in the communities of the region, strengthen the literacy of their language and the conservation of the environment".



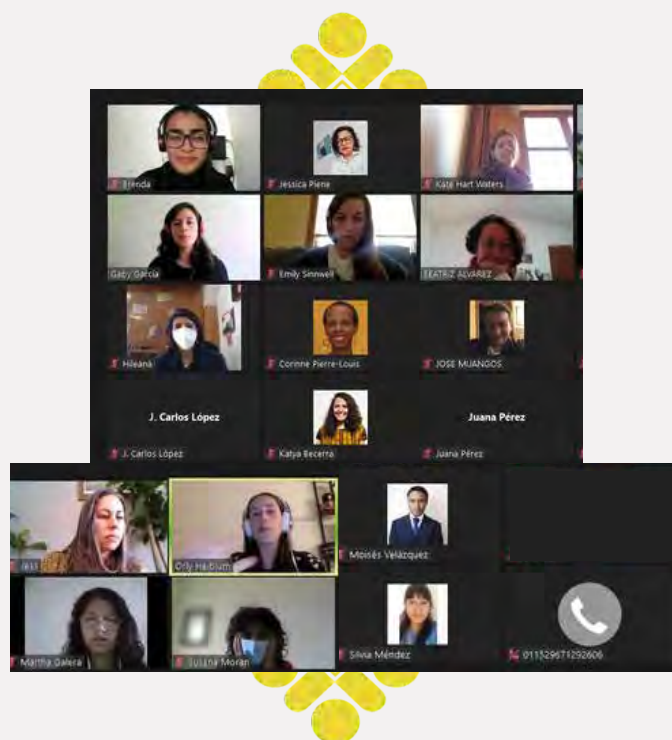
CDD Neighbors for Integral Change

Due to the health issues of the members, this CDD could not have a session at the beginning of the year, they met again in February, to close their process with the coordinator Brenda González. This CDD later paused until June with the integration of Susana Martínez , the new coordinator of the program and this CDD.

CDD Roots for Change

The CDD Roots for Change began the year by reflecting on the first event they held in mid-December 2021, where they raised 365 USD through an online bakery class, and also used the time to make their plans for the current year. Subsequently, they started to prepare the signing of a collaboration agreement between the CDD Roots for Change and Amigos of San Cristobal, which was held in February 2022. This CDD took a hiatus in the months of March and April until the new coordinator who was going to accompany them joined the team.

During these months the Chief Operating Officer was in constant communication with the members.



ACTIVE COMMUNITIES FUND



Visit to the project “Tierra Fertil” accompanied by Concentrarte A.C.

On January 27th, we were in the community of Miguel Hidalgo, in the municipality of Chiapa de Corzo, with a group of students from the Tecnológico de Monterrey, as part of the Tec winter training program. We visited the Women's Project of the garden of Fertile Land (Tierra Fertil) and shared their experiences, organization and achievements of their project.

Visit to the project accompanied by SIPRES A.C.

On February 8th, we visited the “Community Response for Water Conservation” project in the community of Crucilja, San Juan Cancuc. We had the opportunity to see the homes of the families who received a water purification filter, we talked about their usefulness and they shared with us their experience ever since they started the accompaniment by SIPRES.



Visit to the “Hogar Tseltal Saludable” (Healthy Tseltal Home) Project



On March 25th, we visited the Healthy Tseltal Home Project in the community of Pinabetal, Ocosingo. We met the group of women participating in the project, took a tour of the homes where water filters have been installed, and discussed the organization and distribution of responsibilities regarding the savings bank that is part of the activities of this project.

We also had the opportunity to interview some participants with the intention of getting to know their experience and the impact of the project on their quality of life. Special thanks go to IXIM, A.C for the effort and accompaniment to this project.

Participation in the learning binomial strategy sessions

As part of the FCA's activities, the learning binomial strategy is implemented with the objective of peer-to-peer sharing of knowledge and experiences.

So, throughout the months of January to March, we had several meetings with the Punta de Mita Foundation, where we share the work we do as community foundations, as well as share the processes, experiences and projects that are accompanying.
